COMMANDER BACKS O'LEARY CLAIM THAT HE IS NO DEFAULTER

"All Right," Says O. C. of the Central Figure in Guelph Raid.

"It's absolutely all right," said Lieut.-Col. J. L. Young, O. C. of the 1st Depot Battalion, W. O. R., today, when asked by The Advertiser regarding the status of Pte. Patrick J. O'Leary, who Tuesday denied the statements made at Guelph that he was a defaulter, and was apprehended as a result of the military police raid on the Jesuit order there.

"His story is perfectly true," added Lieut.-Col. Young. "He was discharged as a defaulter, and although he should not have had a board for a month yet, yesterday, at his own request, he was given a medical board and discharged. He is in 'A,' and will remain there for training."

RETURNED SOLDIERS HAVE WARM SPOT IN HEARTS FOR ST. MARYS

Outing to Stone Town One of Best of the Season.

About 125 local returned soldiers, patients in the Central Military Convalescent and Wolskel Barracks Hospital, were the guests of the Canadian Club in an auto trip to St. Marys, via Granton and Prospect Hill, on Wednesday afternoon. The party left this city about 2:30 p.m., and was met at the hotel by the returned soldiers. Upon arrival in St. Marys the returned men lined up in front of the Methodist Church, and a speech was made by the mayor, and leading citizens welcomed the veterans on their visit. The returned soldiers who were gathered for the occasion, sang patriotic songs, each child being armed with a flag of the Allies.

At the conclusion of the afternoon entertainment the returned soldiers were taken to the Methodist Sunday school, there being seats for all. The many dainties were served by the Ladies' Patriotic League, and the women's organizations of St. Marys. The returned boys who participated in the trip to St. Marys was one of the best yet, especially in regard to the excellent supper provided.

When the boys in khaki had filled up, a musical program was enjoyed, and in addition to the St. Marys talent returned men joined in and made the entertainment much more informal. Speeches were again on the program for the evening, at the conclusion of which the party left for London, arriving in this city about 8 p.m.

Although the trip was under the auspices of the Canadian Club many other local citizens provided cars for the use of the returned men, who are very grateful for the pleasant trip. Lieut.-Col. A. E. Campbell was present as representative of the Canadian Club, and Aid. E. E. Harley and R. I. Watson also assisted in the arrangements. The Soldiers' Aid Commission arranges these trips and next Wednesday the returned soldiers who are patients in the Byron Sanatorium will be taken for a trip about the country in the vicinity of London.

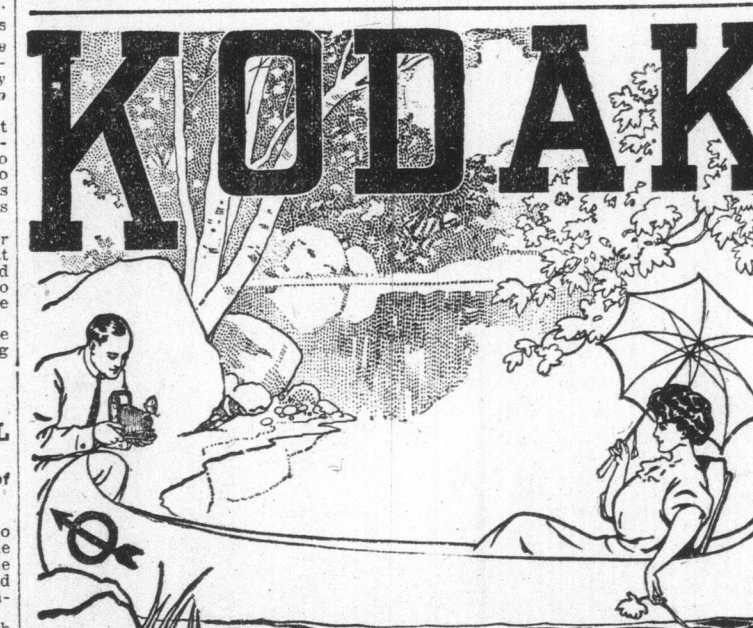
