#### HUMAN EVOLUTION SUBJECT OF TALK BY PROF. CONKLIN

Claims There Are No Two  
Human Beings Alike.

BELIEVES IN EVOLUTION

Social Evolution Making Rapid  
and Alarming Progress.

"There are absolutely no two human beings on the earth alike. There is not one chance in three hundred thousand billion that two children born in succession of the same parents could possibly be alike, or for even twins to be alike," said Professor E. G. Conklin at the Western University extension lecture, held in St. Andrew's Hall on Thursday afternoon, when speaking on "The Limits of Evolution."

"Some people do not believe in evolution, but I do," said Professor Conklin. "I believe that we are coming out of the slime all through the ages to end in something glorious and divine. The question has been raised whether man kind really just goes up a little way, then comes down and then up again. No. Plants and animals have a limit, but the human race has not."

Professor Conklin explained the way the human being is built in a mosaic way, having some traits or peculiarities of each parent and ancestors. Remains have been found in various parts of the world showing that there were large creatures, just a little more than man-size creature, and in the western part of Europe remains have been found of creatures nearer the human being of today, and later we found that the red, white and yellow races were established," said the speaker.

**Present Race Not More Perfect.**  
"Is there any evidence that in the evolution of the race of the present day that the race is more perfect than that of the race in 400 B. C. No, there is degenerative evolution taking it physically. Hair and teeth are lost before the proper time. There has been no progressive evolution noticed among the human race within the last few hundred years. Of course, I will say there are a greater number of intellectual people living today. But we could hardly find such a collection of intellectual men living at the same time as Socrates, Plato, Aristotle, and others. If they were brought here today I think that they would be able to handle our modern day problems the same as they did in their own century."

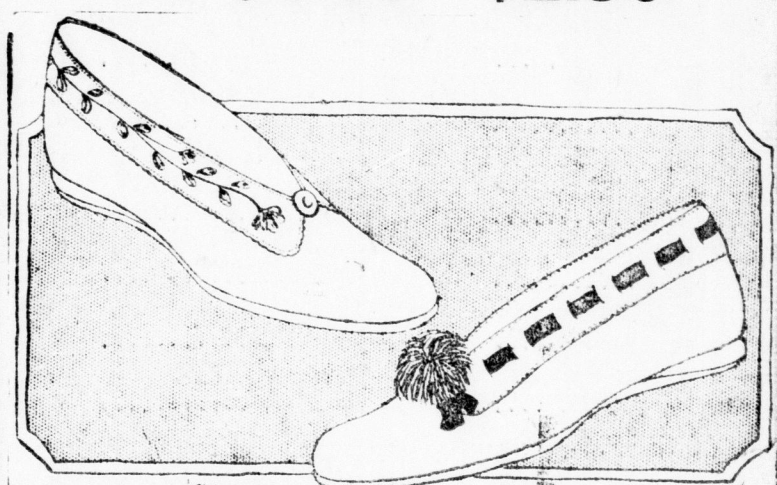
**More Intelligent People Today.**

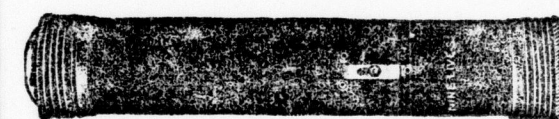

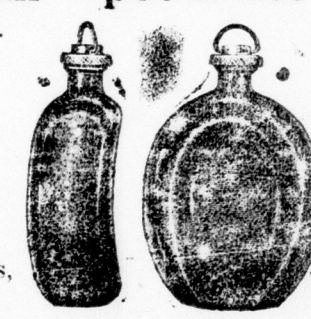

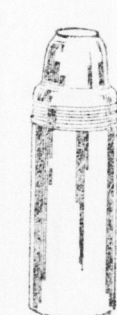
#### RED BLOOD
