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Twenty of the old ladies in residence are over 80-one is 96-but in 15 months there has not been one death. This gratifying record has been due very largely, said Mrs. Fleming, to the splendid care given the aged ladies by the superintendent, Mrs. Woodside.

The home has now 31 in residence, and the maintenance cost is a little

over \$1000 a month. The home has been under very heavy expenses during the past year. The heating apparatus has had to be The heating apparatus has had to be renewed, but is now in excellent condition. Ordinarily the city and government grants combined pay the cost of fuel. This year the grants proved \$300 short of the fuel bill.

## WILL UNVEIL TABLET TO NURSE'S MEMORY

Sister Davis Went Overseas With University Base Hospital-Contracted Fever.

On Friday evening next, a tablet in memory of Nursing Sister Lena A. Davis, who died while on active serwine on active service overseas, will be unveiled in the Western Hospital. Miss Davis was a graduate of that hospital in 1908, and the Alumnae Association is erecting

the Alumnae Association is erecting the trifute to her memory.

At the outbreak of the war, Miss Davis was the matron of the Hospital for the Insane on King street, a position which she held for several years. She went overseas with the University Base Hospital unit which was sent to Base Hospital unit which was sent to Saloniki, and it was while on duty there that she contracted malaria and was invalided to England. Altho extremely ill and never fully recovered from the effects of the disease, Nursing Sister Davis went on duty again, in England, at Basingstoke, where she died of black water fever

in Februray, 1918.
Miss Davis' home was in Beamsville where her mother still lives. A sister was for a number of years a member of the teaching staff of the city schools, but has since died. The tablet is being placed in the Assembly Hall of the Hospital, and the friends of the late Miss Davis are invited to the ceremony next
