



Earl Beatty said: "I feel it indeed a great honor and privilege that I should be asked to address such an assembly of power. I have been in a somewhat varied career in many curious places, but I have never been asked to address so distinguished and so important an audience. I understand that this club has for one of its objects the inculcation of patriotism. Could there possibly be a greater? During the last war—the greatest in history—the patriotism of the women of the world who were embroiled in the war was put to a greater test than ever before. The women met the test in a manner which commanded admiration of and was an inspiriation to all men. Mothers and wives sent their sons and husbands with smiles on their lips to do their duty, and it seems to me that patriotism is not required to be taught very much, because there is an ample supply of its laways at hand.


