NOT TURPIN'S SETTLE.

The Modern Highwayman in New Brunswick and Times His Predecessors. London, July 30.—People here have been rubbing their eyes today and asking themselves whether Dick Turpin is really dead and whether the events of the past century and a quarter are not all a dream. It appears that about 11 o'clock, yesterday Miss Bright, the daughter of General Robert Bright, K. C. B., was stopped by a man in the Crow's Nest Wood, near Guilford, a market town in Kent, about fifteen miles from London.
