HIGHBINBER FIGHT

It Takes Place in the Very Heart
Of San Francisco.Three Men Killed, Two Mortally
Wounded and Nine Arrested.

Fresno, Cal., April 20.—A bloody highbinder war that has been expected for some days, broke out in Chinatown to-day, and as a result three Mongolians occupy slabs in the morgue, two more are at the county hospital, mortally wounded, and nine are behind the bars in the county jail.

Not a policeman was on duty in the region where the row started, as the Chinamen decamped from the various quarters remote from the scene of intended battle. Upon hearing the first shot, Policeman Rapelli, who was a block away, ran to the scene and saw two Chinamen pumping lead into the body of a third, who lay at their feet. Further up an alley were at least dozen Chinamen blazing away at each other. As Rapelli ran up the alley a Chinaman ran past him pursued by a highbinder.

The fugitive made for the doorway, but was dropped on the steps by a bullet from the highbinder's gun, which killed him instantly. Rapelli captured the murderer, who gave his name as Wong Duck.

Policeman Morris saw a highbinder run up to a Chinaman standing in a doorway and deliberately fire two shots at him, killing him instantly. The murderer started to run and Morris ordered him to stop, but instead the highbinder threw his gun at Morris and went on. Morris fired and brought his man down.

GREAT MAN HUNT

How the Kamloops Murderer was
Finally Run Down.Coroner in a Cabin by a Thousand
People—Surrender or Death

Kamloops, B. C., April 20.—Casimir Bapstis, the Indian who murdered Philip Walker here Saturday evening, without the least provocation, is now behind the bars in Kamloops. About midnight this morning word was brought to town that the murderer was in Chief Louis' house on the reserve, just across the river from the city. The chief being absent, McLean was again sent to tell Casimir that if he did not surrender by one o'clock the police would open fire on him. Time dragged on, and still the murderer, rifle in hand, paced up and down the room, passing and repassing the open window in full view of all present. Shortly after twelve, women and children were removed from the adjacent houses, and the arrangements made to open fire. McLean again interviewed Casimir, with the result that Casimir promised to surrender if he were allowed to fire off all his ammunition. This was granted, and a few minutes later Casimir appeared at the upper window and fired on shots. The last two coming dangerously close to two citizens. Casimir then threw down his rifle, and bravely, he once again opened the door, walked out, and quietly stepped into a rig which was waiting to convey him to jail.

Later he was safely behind the bars. The most intense excitement prevailed all along. The County Court, which was session, adjourned, and everybody either went to the reserve or secured places on the tops of buildings where they could see every movement. Over 1,000 people followed the vehicle containing the prisoner to the goal, and when the doors closed behind Casimir they gave a cheer and dispersed. Casimir will be tried at the assizes here next week.
