ARM BREAKS UP
MEETING OF BODY

Opposition to Be Made to the
V. & S. As to Gravel
Hauling

ally routine business occupied the
attention of the members of the North
district Municipal Council on Monday
at which an alarm of fire was given
by some ladies. The council imme-
diately left the court house without
formality of a motion for adjourn-
ment proceeded to fight the fire
which was smouldering within the
detonator of C. C. Cochran, the man-
ager and owner of the Sidney Trading
Company. The fire had not started to
itself but was satisfied by emit-
ting a cloud of smoke, and did not take
any long time for such valiant fight
to subside such a weak fire. The
cause was by the faulty con-
struction of a fireplace, some timbers
being used by the woodmen in the
brick.

Before the hasty "adjournment" of
the council everything was going as
smoothly as clockwork, the only diver-
sion being Councilor Hewitt's protest
that the payment of one month's
rent for January to Dr. W. G. Cum-
mings as health officer.

During the meeting pointed out to him
at a previous meeting, and he was
advised, without Councilor Hewitt dis-
senting, that the doctor's duties com-
menced immediately, and as he was ap-
pointed during the month of January
he performed work during the month
he was entitled to his salary. There
was a large number of spectators pre-
sent, some expecting to see a lively
debate on a corner occasion, but prob-
ably were present to see what effect
Councilor Hewitt's presence would have on
the council, and if so they were also
appointed, as he did not arrive in
time to be present.

Meeting Reeve A. J. McKenna, who
acted the chair, and Councilors
McIntyre, Ego and Hewitt were also
present.

Communication was read from S.
Martinez, complaining that Mr. A.
Hudson had constructed a septic tank
his (Hudson's) premises and was
causing the overflow across Fifth
street into his (Martinez's) property.
A complaint will be investigated.

The Premier and A. E. McPhillips,
P.P., both acknowledged receipt of
the council's resolution concerning
the termination of ownership and operation
of telephones. These were filed.
Tenders were opened for the clearing
of Third street extension as follows:
A. Bates, \$100; H. A. McKillop,
\$15; S. Roberts, \$4; Alex. Craig, \$10;
Messrs. Brown & Sproule, \$49.50.
The lowest tender will be allowed to
do the work.

Councilor Hewitt requested Mr.
Egon, the road foreman, to move
to his interview with Mr. Ir-
vine, the government assistant en-
gineer, with reference to the unex-
pected balance of last year's government
fund. He reported that he was in-
structed to use the money to the best
advantage on the main trunk roads.
This report was adopted.

Mr. Fagan's letter, which was read
at a former meeting and laid on the
table, was next taken up. This con-
tained a request that the council do
\$30 towards the fund of the Anti-
tuberculosis Society.

Councilor Ego said he was not in
favor of making a grant, as he un-
derstood the society did not receive
any free patients, and moved that no
grant be given. This was seconded and the
motion carried.

The annual loan-by-law was next
taken up and was advanced several
times and will be finally passed at
the next regular meeting. The by-law
provides for the borrowing of the sum
one thousand dollars, payable from
rent revenue.

Councilor Hewitt moved, seconded
Councilor Ego, that the clerk
write up prices on road ploughs. This
was carried.

The street along Sidney which
V. & S. railway enters Sidney will
be further graded and gravelled from
B avenue to Beacon avenue, provid-
ing Mr. Van Sant will furnish cars and
transportation from gravel pits near
the acting foreman by Councilor
Ego were appointed a committee to
interview this gentleman.

The council next took up the pay-
ment of accounts, and were progress-
ing favorably when the alarm of fire
was given. After the council returned
to their accounts were passed and ad-
journment taken for two weeks.

After adjournment an informal dis-
cussion took place on the subject of
protection, and no doubt the sub-
ject will again come up formally at the
next or some other meeting of the
council.
