PROF. LEACOCK'S INSPIRING APPEAL FOR IMPERIALISM

When Prof. Stephen B. Leacock began the first address of what Premier Pugsley aptly called his "imperial mission," before the Canadian Club of St. John last night, he faced an audience composed of the most prominent and influential men in the political, literary, commercial and professional life of the city.

The attendance was the largest since the first luncheon of the Club, when Dr. Parkin was the speaker. Dr. Parkin's tour of the Empire under the auspices of the Imperial Federation League also began in St. John and in the same building.

After being introduced to the audience in a happy manner by Dr. T. D. Walker, in the presence of President Earle, Prof. Leacock rose amid great applause. He began by alluding to the phenomenon of the reverend falls, which in St. John's especial variety and presumed that this gave to the people a cast of mind which made them capable of looking on all sides of a subject.

In England he would tell something of his labors in the various parts of the Empire that he had visited. "There is a feeling abroad," he said, "that one who calls himself an imperialist is a dangerous character, who is always going about with a club on his shoulder, looking for trouble, and who talks too much on a subject of which he knows too little. Some people say that the imperialist is too far ahead of the times, and others that he is too far behind. But unconsciously or consciously, we are all imperialists. If we want the British Empire, which needs no overdone rhetoric to tell the story of its greatness, to remain permanent, then we are imperialists. That is the test. If we are indifferent as to whether it endures or not, then we are not imperialists."

Prof. Leacock then recounted some of the stormy periods of the Empire's colonial expansion, remarking that the British people were of an exploring and adventurous disposition, and not afraid to leave home, and this was one of the secrets of their greatness. This spirit was lacking in the Germans, and not present to the same extent in
