For the first time in weeks Ty Cobb lost points last week. He dropped six. Another strange incident in connection with Cobb's work last week was the fact that he didn't steal a base.

Another member of the Detroit team who is pounding out hits with regularity is Crawford, and he has boosted his average more than 20 points in the last three weeks. The veteran is carrying his best season with the slug since his entrance into major league circles.

Jim Delehanty is not only playing a great game, at first base for the Tigers, but is also hitting consistently. His excellent work on the first station has caused Hughie Jennings to keep Del. Gairner on the bench, although he has entirely recovered from his injury of the early spring. Two disappointments of the Detroit team this year in hitting are Moriarty and Eddie Collins.

Eddie Collins is sliding, and on two successive days last week failed to get a hit. Frank Baker, third baseman of the Athletics, may be put down as one of the great sluggers in baseball. He is a consistent batsman and has been doing heroic service for Connie Mack this year.

The three Chicago men, Harry Lord, Jimmy Callahan and Matty McIntyre, who had the country talking about their great work last month, are tumbling and Callahan now scarcely has a safe hold on the 300 mark.
