against those who committed the amount on Victoria Hall, and upon the persons of some of the parties who were present at the late dinner given to the Opposition members of the Old Newcastle District, in this town, was brought to a close, and on Wednesday the decision was rendered by the sitting magistrates. They found eleven persons guilty of riot and violent assult, and remanded them for trial at the Queen's Bench. Eight of them only were in town, who gave bail for their appearance at the assizes, which takes place here in October next. The other three are at present in parts unknown. Cobourg Sentine!

The Washington correspondence of the New York Tribune says: "every Mail from New York comes laden with remonstrations from bankers and merchants respecting the action of the government in acising the money of Southerners held in trust in New York. It is urged in these papers that the government is acting precipitately in this matter, and that it may damage irretrievably its credit, abroad by these wholesale seizures. So far as the libelling of ships, held in the whole or in the part by the Southerners, is concerned, there is not much Southerners, is concerned, there is not much said, but they endeavour to obtain money in bank, placed there by Southerners in trust, is said to look like the very worst nort of Southern repudiation. The presumption is that the owners of this money must be loyal or they would not have sent it North; at any rate, we were having the use of the money, and it was not wise to compel the bankers to send it to England. Very much surprise is manifested in government circles at the feeling this matter has called out, and I understand orders have been sent District Attorney Smith to moderate his zeal."
