

Something About a Canadian Product. Although Canada is the graat pro-ducer and exporter of asbestos, that article, which is yearly coming into wider use, is found in many parts of the United States. There are deposits in Maryiand and Virginia within a few riles of Washington, and many of the deposits of this country are worked on a commercial scale. Des-pite this, however, the American in-dustries dependent on asbestos rely on the Canadian mines or the Cana-dian quarrie; for their supply. Asbestos is a curious substance that has been known for many cent-uries. Many of the peorles of ancient times used it, and it was sometimes wrough into soft and flexible cloth, which was used as a shroud for the dead. There are many varieties, and a large number of common and des-criptive names have been applied to these varieties. Ligniform asbestos, popularly called "mountain wood," is a variety presenting an irregular fila-mentous structure like wood. Other varieties are taben ther, fossil paper and fossil flax. Asbestos in modern times has come to be very extensively manufactured into incombustible cloth, gloves, feit, paper and other articles of common use, and is much used as a covering to steam boilers and pipes, *- the monufacture of gas stoves, and, mixed with matall' pignents, it is described as a paint for wooden structures. Toofs, parition: and the like to ren-der them fireproof or fire-resistent. It is found in most parts of the world, chieffy in connection with tur-pentine.
