Believes the present tariff burdensome to the farmer and the masses of the people, and against the interests of the Maritime Provinces generally. KIRKPATRICK, *Lieut.-Col.* GEORGE AIREY, *LL.D., Q.C.* (*Frontenac.*)

Fourth s. of the late Thomas Kirkpatrick, Esq., Q.C., a native of Coolmine, near Dublin, who represented Frontenac in the Commons from the Union until his death, March 1870, by the dau. of the late Alex. Fisher, Esq., Judge of the Midland District. B. in Kingston 13 Sept., 1841. Ed. at Kingston Grammar Sch., at High Sch., St. John's, P.Q., and at Trinity Coll., Dublin; graduated at latter institution as Moderator and Silver Medallist, Dec. 1861, and received the degree of B.A. and LL.B. Became LL.D., June 1883. M., 1st, Oct. 1865, Frances Jane, dau. of the late Hon. John Macaulay (she d. 20 Jan., 1877); 2nd, 26 Sept., 1883, Isabel Louise, youngest dau. of Sir D. L. Macpherson, Senator. Called to the Bar, U.C., Hilary Term, 1865. Appt. a Q.C. 11 Oct., 1880. Is Presdt. of the Kingston Water Works Co. and of the Canada Locomotive Works, Kingston; Lieut.-Col. commanding 47 Frontenac Batt. V.M.; Presdt. of Dominion Rifle Asso., and dir. of the Kingston and Pembroke Railway. Commanded the Wimbledon Rifle Team, 1876. Was an Hon. Commr. at the Colonial and Indian Exhibition, London, 1886. First returned to Parlt., April 1870, on death of his father, the sitting member; re-elected by acclamation at g.e., 1872; again returned at g.e., 1874; re-elected at g.e., 1878, and by acclamation at g.e., 1882; re-elected at last g.e. Was Speaker of the House of Commons from 8 Feb., 1883, until 1886. A Liberal Conservative.—*Closeburn, Kingston, Ont.; Toronto Club; Rideau Club.*
