Elphinstone for eminent services on this occasion, as also a handsome testimonial from H.R.H. Opened the Dominion Lands Office in Manitoba, and was, until retiring on superannuation in 1877. Ed. at St. John's College (under Bishop Anderson), where he took a scholarship 1857. M. 1861, Letitia, dau. of Rev. Geo. Flett, of Okanese Mission, N.W. Ter. First returned to Parlt. for St. Charles at g.e. Dec. 1878. Elected for present seat at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative in Federal politics, and was a supporter of the Norquay-Royal Administration. Insists on the maintenance of the French language in the Legislature and Courts of Law.—St. Charles P.O., Man.
