Official Oaths Bill.

An Act for making one uniform provision respecting certain Official and other Oaths to be taken in this Province, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

HEREAS the Oaths required to be taken as a Preamble, qualification for Office or for other temporal purposes, are, in Upper Canada, prescribed by an Act of the late Parliament, passed in the third year of the reign of

- 5 His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chaptered twelve, and intituled, "An Act to dispense with the neces- Act U.C. "sity of taking certain oaths and making certain declara- dited." "rations in the cases therein mentioned; and also to "render it unnecessary to receive the Sacrament of the
- 10 "Lord's Supper, as a qualification for offices or for other "temporal purposes;" And whereas with a view to making the law uniform in this respect in both sections of the Province, it is expedient to repeal the same Act and reenact the provisions thereof, making them applicable to
- 15 the whole Province: Be it therefore enacted, &c.

That the said recited Act shall be and the same is hereby The said Act repealed. repealed.

II. And be it enacted, That from and after the passing No other oath of this Act it shall not be necessary for any person ap-but those hereinafter
20 pointed or to be appointed to any office in this Province prescribed, to be required of civil or military, or who is or may be Mayor or other be required of certain officers officer or member of any Corporation therein, or for any &c. person admitted, called or received or hereafter to be admitted, called or received as a Barrister, Advocate,

25 Notary Public, Attorney, Solicitor or Proctor, to make any declaration or subscription, or to take or subscribe any other oath than the oath following, that is to say :

" I, A. B., do sincerely promise and swear, that I will The Oath of be faithful and bear true allegiance to Her Majesty Queen

- 30 Victoria, (or the reigning Sovereign for the time being,) as lawful Sovereign of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of this Province, dependant on and belonging to the said Kingdom, and that I will defend Her to the utmost of my power against all traitorous con-
- 35 spiracies and attempts whatever which shall be made against Her Person, Crown or Dignity, and that I will do my utmost endeavour to disclose and make known to Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors, all treasons and traitor-
