II. And be it further enacted, That where no Goods, Lands, Houses, or Effects of such absent or absconding Person, in the Hands or under the Management of his Agent, Factor, Attorney, or Trustee, shall be exposed to view, or can be come at, so as to be attached, it shall and may be lawful to and for any person entitled to any such Action as Agent, &c. of an absconding Debtaforesaid, to file a Declaration against such absent or to be summonor absconding Person in the Office of the Clerk of the Supreme Court of Judicature, therein setting forth, particularly, his Debt and Damage, and how they may have arisen; and also to cause Process and Trial the Attorney, Factor, Agent, or Trustee of such thereupon. absent or absconding Person, to be served with a Summons out of the said Clerk's Office, being annexed to the Declaration Fourteen Days previous to the Sitting of the said Supreme Court; which being duly served, and Return duly made thereof, under the Hand of the Provost Marshal, or any of his Deputies, shall be sufficient in Law to bring forward a Trial, without other or further Summons, unless the Principal be an Inhabitant, or hath for some Time had his Residence within this Island; in which case a like Summon, swith an attested Copy of the Declaration thereto annexed, shall also be left at his Dwelling House, Lodging, or Place of his last and usual Abode, Fourteen Days before the Sitting of the Court. And such Attorney, Factor, Agent, or Trustee, upon his desire, shall be admitted to defend the Suit, on behalf of his Principal, throughout the course of the Law, and an Imparlance shall be granted two Terms successively, that he may have an opportunity to notify his Principal thereof; and at the third Term, without special Matter alledged and allowed in Bar, Abatement, or further Continuance, the Cause shall peremptorily come to Trial; and if Judgment shall have been rendered for the Plaintiff, then all the Goods, Effects, Credits, and Estate of any kind whatsoever of such absent or absconding Person, in the Hands of such Attorney Factor, Agent, or Trustee, or under his Care or
