Camp Borden	8-2-45		<p>0800 hours, ceiling 1000', visibility 3 miles. No flying all day due to snow. No night flying.</p> <p>The V.D. Basketball team played the C.W.A.C. team in our Drill Hall and defeated them by the score of 24-8. LAV Sauvè was the outstanding performer for our aggregation.</p> <p>Our Woodcraft Shop is getting well under way in its new quarters, and added interest in this work is already being shown by Station personnel. Cpl. Wilson, in charge of the Woodwork Shop, is capable of giving plenty of help and assistance to those who need aid in their projects. A group to work on plastics is now being formed, as well as one combining art, modelling, and the rudiments of pottery. Our Hobby and Handicraft Clubs are meeting with great success under the able leadership of Squadron Leader Buchanan.</p>	
	9-2-45		<p>0800 hours, ceiling 7000', visibility 2 miles. Flying washed out at 0830 hours due to fog. Flying washed in at 1300 hours, washed out at 1715 hours due to low ceiling. No night flying. 131:05 hours.</p> <p>Station personnel were shocked to receive word that F/O J.D.H. Martin J38065, flying instructor of 'B' Flight and his student, LAC J.G. Powell, Aus. 441451, were instantly killed in a flying accident near Big Bay Point at 1700 hours. They were doing instrument sequences in Harvard II, 2987 and the cause of the accident is very obscure. This has been the first category 'A' crash at Camp Borden for some time and it is to be hoped that we have no more of these unfortunate accidents.</p>

Flying washed in at 0900 hours, washed out at 1200 hours. 1300 hours, ceiling 1500', visibility 1 mile, flying washed in at 1300 hours, washed out at 1430 hours. Total flying time 35:25 hours.</p> <p>A Memorial Service was held in Barrie this afternoon for F/O J.D.H. Martin before shipment of the body to his home at St. John, New Brunswick.</p> <p>The usual Protestant and Roman Catholic Services were held on the Station and Christian Science and Jewish personnel attended services in the Y.M.C.A. Chapel in the Army Area.</p>
