THE REPORT, UNCONFIRMED BY ANY AUTHORITATIVE SOURCES, WAS BASED ON THE VISIT MADE TO FORT BELVEDERE YESTERDAY BY LORD DAWSON OF PENN, THE KING'S PHYSICIAN.

SOME SOURCES SAID LORD DAWSON TRIED TO PERSUADE HIM TO TAKE A
THREE-MONTH LEAVE OF OFFICE, WITH A REGENCY COUNCIL TO ACT
DURING THE INTERIM.

THE EMPIRE CRISIS DREW CLOSE TO A CLIMAX WITH THE SERIES OF CONFERENCES THIS MORNING AFTER THE KING MOTORED IN FROM FORT BEL-VEDERE TO BUCKINGHAM PALACE BEFORE MOST OF LONDON WAS AWAKE AND SENT MONCKTON TO 10 DOWNING STREET.
