of the property and if satisfied, of which I feel sure they will be, of the virtue of the ground, equip and work it on a major seale.

In respect to the assessment Work for the year 1937 and 1938 on above Leases, please note as follows: In December 1937, I was in Los Angeles, California, in an effort to raise capital for our property. I made an Affidavit covering the Assessment work for the year 1937 and for excess work for 1938 to the amount of \$1030.00. Said Affidavit was sworn by me before the Assistant British Consul in that City and I forwarded same to the Mining Recorder at Lillooet in time to reach him before the expiration date of said Leases.

I understand, however, that as only one year's Recording Fees were paid by the office of the Companyat the time, the excess work above mentioned was not recorded. The excess work was done, however, and the Affidavit covering same referred to above, is to the best of my knowledge in the office of the Mining Recorder at Lillocet, and a copy of same in the Company's office in Vancouver.

So far, our Company has not derived one cent of revenue out of said property, and it has been a continual expense on the part of a few friends and myself to get the property into such shape as would interest working capital. On account of the great number of large boulders encountered on the property, it will require an expensive plant to successfully operate it, and as I said before, I have men with such, ready to enter upon the ground immediately authority is granted to them for the purpose.

I will, therefore, deeply appreciate your assistance in the matter.
