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March 15 John Cappulon to James Lenihan - Plow for an Indian named Napoleon at Nicola Lake.

April 7 Anderson, McKinlay and Sproat to Supt. General of Indian Affairs - Opinion on Order in Council of Feb. 23, 1877.

May 12 A.C. Elliott (Provincial Secretary B.C.) to Sproat - Work of Indian Reserve Commission to be delayed as changes are in contemplation.

May 17 T. Elwyn to McKinlay and Sproat - Information obtained from Mr. O'Keefe about the state of the Indians in the Upper Country.

June 26 Indian Commissioners to Mr. Lenihan - Reserves at Burrard Inlet.

June 29 John Clappentor to Indian Commissioners. Setting of Commissioners at Nicola.

July 16 Commissioners to Lenihan - Settling the Shuswap nation of Indians.

July 23 Nazaire Norwest to Commissioners - Claim to land in Okanagan.

Aug. 14 Commissioners to Provincial Secretary - Progress of the Commission.

Aug. 17 Commissioners to Chief Commissioner Lands and Works British Columbia - Inquire when lands around O'Kanagan Lake were opened to pre-emption.

Aug. 18 B.F. Fexh to Sproat - Complains of Indians on his land.

Aug. 31 Commissioners to J.C. Haynes - Asking that records of land in the vicinity of Indian Reserves should not be issued until the Commissioners have passed over the ground.

Aug. 31 James Lenihan to Commissioners - Letter from Father McGuikin.
Enclosure: Aug. 25, 1877, Father McGuikin to James Lenihan - Danger of Indian uprising if Reserve question not settled satisfactorily.

James Lenihan to Commissioners transmitting copies of letters from Rev. M.C. Pandosey and J.C. Haynes of 8 & 9 Aug. 1877 respectively re unconfirmed reports involving border hostilities Can. & U.S. Indian tribes & rumors of stolen livestock & property.

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
