

On these balances your Committee beg leave to remark :—	
1st. (a)	This sum is to be laid out and expended by Commissioners, who are required by Law to make a Report of their proceedings annually, before the Governor and the two Branches of the Legislature, which Report has not been laid before the House since 1809.
2d. (b)	This sum, excepting £500 appropriated for Plans, and mostly expended, remains in the Public Chest.
3d. (c)	Of this sum, £10,000 was last Session appropriated for the erection of a Common Gaol in the Town of Three Rivers, in a Bill which was reserved for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure thereon.
£10000	A further sum of £500 was granted for temporary Houses of Correction—and
500	A further sum of £6500 for the Quebec Gaol, has been voted during the present Session.
