Major Burclay, reported to the Houfe that the Committee had waited upon his Excellency upon the fubject of the feveral Petitions from this Houfe to his Majefty in the laft Seffion, and that his Excellency was pleafed to inform them, he had transmitted to his Majefty's Ministers the feveral Petitions and Papers delivered to him by the Houfe, in their laft Seffion, and had received two Letters from his Majetty's Secretary of State, acknowledging he had received the fame, and that they had been laid before his Majefty, and that his Excellency had received no further Anfwer to fuch Petitions.

Major Millidge, purfuant to leave given, prefented a Bill for preventing the Introduction of indigent and diffolute Perfons into this Province, which are, or may be likeley to become Chargeable to the fame, and the fame was read a first Time.

Refolved, That the Bill do lie on the Table to be read a fecond Time.

Mr. Jessen, pursuant to leave given presented a Bill in Addition to and Amendment of an Act made in the 28th Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intitled an Act for the better Establishment of Fees, &c. as regulated by the Governor and Council at the request of the House of Assembly, and the same was read a sirst Time.

Refalved, That the Bill do lie on the Table to be read a fecond Time.

Then the House adjourned until Monday at half past Nine of the Clock.

A Petition of Alexander Cocken was prefented by Mr. Leckie, and read, fetting forth : that he has been appointed Keeper of the Light House on M<sup>Nutts</sup> Island, by his Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, and praying some allowance for his services.

Ordered, That it do lie on the Table.

Major Barclay, reported from the Committee and prefented a Bill for applying certain Monies therein mentioned for the Services of the Year 1790, and for appropriating such part of the supplies granted in the said Year 1790, as now remain unappropriated, which was read a first time,

On Motion the faid Bill was read a fecond time, committed, Ordered to be engroffed and read a third time.
