

A message from the Council informing the House that they have concurred in passing the bill "*In addition to an Act intitled 'An Act for appointing Commissioners of Sewers'* also the bill "*For preserving the Bank of the River Saint John in front of the Parishes of Magerville, Sheffield and Waterborough*" and the bill "*For appropriating and disposing of the Public Monies*".
