1-The total acreage in the pronce assessed in the year 1907 under the provisions of the act.—In 15 large and 286 small Local Improvemen Districts 27,155,424 acres were assessed. In 24 small districts from which complete returns have not yet been received, and in 21 districts in which it is known that no assess ent was made, it is estimated that bout 3,250,000 acres are assessable.

2-The total amount collected unler the provisions of the said act up to the 31st January, 1908 .- No information is available as to the amamount transmitted, to departmen and placed to credit of fund down to Jan. 31, was \$194,206.88.
