ed was one for the incorporation of the Fathers of La Salette, and one from Ernest Laycock of Regina praying to be admitted a member of the Law Society of Saskatchewan.

The Free Text Book Act was read a first time.

The return asked for by Mr. Haultain in the first days of the session was brought down. The Information has reference to the Supplementary Revenue Act.

The questions and replies are as follows:

1.—The total acreage in the province assessed in the year 1907 under the provisions of the act.—In 15 large and 280 small Local Improvement Districts 27,155,424 acres were assessed. In 24 small districts from which complete returns have not yet been received, and in 21 districts in which it is known that no assessment was made, it is estimated that about 3,250,000 acres are assessable.

2.—The total amount collected under the provisions of the said act up to the 31st January, 1908.—No information is available as to the amounts collected under the act. The amount transmitted to the department and placed to credit of fund down to Jan. 31, was \$104,206.88.

3.—The amount to the credit of the Supplementary Revenue Fund on the 15th of January and the 31st of January 1908. Amounts to credit: On January 15, \$84,439.46; on January 31, \$104,206.88.

4.—The amount of monies assessed and remaining unpaid under the provisions of the Supplementary Revenue Act on the 31st of January, 1908.—No definite information is to hand as to the actual assessment, or as to collections made by treasurers of districts on January 31st, 1908, but on Feb. 24, on an assessment (partly estimated as stated above) of 30,401,949 acres collections aggregating \$114,264.56 had been transmitted to the provincial treasurer leaving an estimated amount unpaid or paid and not transmitted, of \$189,771.69.

5.—The sum (if any) paid to the credit of the Supplementary Revenue Fund out of the general revenue fund under provisions of section 14 of the said Act.—\$85,000, of which amount \$30,250.66 has been since repaid out of collections transmitted since January 15.

6.—The several amounts showing the percentage of the whole amount (in each case) set apart under headings (a), (b), (c), and (d) in section 15 of the said act.—Under provisions of section 15 of the said act the Lieutenant-governor-in-council have provided another manner of distribution in lieu of that laid down in the act in terms following: (a) For the establishment and maintenance of an agricultural college, no grant for the year 1907; (b) For the establishment and maintenance of a university of Saskatchewan, the sum of \$2,988.78, being 2 per cent. of the amount available for distribution under the act, that proportion of the maximum percentage provided for by the act being approximately the proportion of the assessment collected; (c) For the support of secondary institutions \$182.00, being the amount required to pay grants to the Regina, Mooseomin, Prince Albert and Moose Jaw schools, under section 18 of the Supplementary Revenue Act, being a sum less than the percentage authorised by section 17 of the said act; (d) For the support of such rural schools as were not kept open for sixty days during the year 1907, a sum not exceeding \$2,500 to be distributed in accordance with such regulations in that behalf as may be made by the Lieutenant-governor-in-council. (e) For the support of primary educational institutions, the sum of \$142,088.68, being the balance of the amount available for distribution for the payments hereinbefore set forth.

7.—The aggregate amount payable to high school districts under clauses (a) and (b) of sub-section 1 of section 18 of the said Act.—\$1,706.00, the sum of \$156 being at present in dispute.

8.—The actions (if any) taken under sub-sections 2 and 3 of section 18 of the said act.—No action was taken.

9.—The several amounts payable and paid respectively under clauses (a), (b), and (c) of sub-section 1 of section 19 of the said act.—Payable under clause (a), being 5 per cent. of \$142,088.68, \$7,104.43. Payable under clause (b) \$111,840.00, at the rate of \$120 to 932 schools. Payable under clause (c) \$111,840.00, at the rate of \$120 to 932 schools. 10.—The amount (if any) available for distribution under sub-section 2 of section 19 of the said act.—The number of rural schools entitled to share in the distribution.—Amount available \$23,144.68. Number of schools, 982.

11.—The amount (if any) actually paid under the provisions of section 19 of the said act.—Vouchers passed by auditor for \$134,598.06.

12.—The amount set apart under provisions of sections 15 and 17 of the said act, and kept in trust by the provincial treasurer in the university trust account under the provisions of section 98 of the University Act.—Amount set apart, \$2,988.78. Money not yet paid over.

13.—The amount set apart and kept in the trust account known as the Agricultural College fund, under the provisions of section 16 of the act.—No money set apart.

MONDAY, APRIL 13th.

There was very little done in the House today. Mr. Wellington presented a petition from Moose Jaw city praying for the confirmation of certain bylaws, and Mr. Sutherland presented another, asking for an act to amend the Saskatchewan Elks' Club Act.

The return asked for by Mr. Haultain regarding buildings, taken over from the Dominion by the province and relating to printing and advertising, was ordered.

The premier explained that the government were waiting to consider the resolutions passed by the Local Improvements Districts convention before proceeding with the bill affecting amendments to the Local Improvement Act.

Mr. Calder explained that he was waiting for samples of the free readers before going on with the Free School Books Bill.

The Marriage Ordinance Amendments Bill was read a second time and, with the consent of the House, was considered in committee. It provides for a minister publishing banns to give a certificate to that effect. Banns will only have to be published once on two Sundays.
