### DIRECT NEGOTIATIONS

Now Proceeding Between the Czar and Roosevelt.

President of United States Sald to Be Taking Direct Steps to Save Peace Conference -- Count Lamsdorff Declares Russia's Ultimatum, But Witte Doubts If He Did-Linevitch Reports Successes.

Portsmouth, N. H., Aug. 25.-Up to 11 o'clock last night six cablegrams had been received by M. Witte from St. Petersburg. All came from Count Lamsdorff and all were opposed to the Japanese compromise proposition as presented at Wednesday's meeting. However, it is positively stated that the cablegrams announce that direct pour parlers are now in progress between Emperor Nicholas and President Roosevelt.

Still a Chance.

The prospects of peace seem des-perate, but they are not hopeless, despite the prevailing pessimism.

There is still a chance, and the forces working for peace are, continuing their labors. The result of Ambassador Meyers audience at Peterhof dor Meyers audience at Peternoi Wednesday was unsatisfactory, but at least it was no rebuff. It left the door open, and within a few hours after the receipt at Oyster Bay of Mr. Meyer's account of his audience the president had sent a new appeal through M. Witte, who received it from Mr. Pierce about 3 o'clock this morning. The Emperor had already in effect declined the proposed compromise offered by Japan.

One detachment in the Tzinche Valley occupied the village of Lagovtzeakzy; another operated in the direction of Schimladzy, and a third dislodged the Japanese from their position on the south-ward of Mopeyschan. The three Russian columns drove the Japanese back to their position near Sendjan."

The nature of this action is not disclosed but it is known that it contemplates the military occupation of a Moroccan town near the Algerian frontier, probably Oudjda, owing to its proximity to a large French garrison in Algeria and to its strategic importance, as it commands the route to the interior of Morocco and the capital, Fez.
