Our Taxes.

It may be a matter of surprise to the rate-payers of the town to learn that it has been necessary to increase the taxation from \$1.00 to \$1.15 on the hundred dollars...

Town Council Meeting.

The regular monthly meeting of the Town Council was held on Tuesday evening. In the absence of the Mayor and presiding councillor, Coun. Davison occupied the chair.

The following bills were read and ordered paid: Township of Horton \$28.55, Acadia Edison Electric Co. \$9.40, J. E. Eagles 1.00, Valley Telephone Co. .20, J. W. Vaughn .40, B. E. Harris 2.75, Kings Co. 4.75, T. L. Harvey 2.08, Postage, etc. 2.08.

Bill of Aubrey Brown for snow-plowing the streets, amounting to \$47.50, was read. Resolved that Aubrey Brown be paid at the rate of 40 cents per hour, for the amount of work performed as the snow-plow, as per bill rendered.

The following communications were read: From C. M. Vaughn and G. C. Johnson, resigning position of assessors for the town.

From W. W. Taylor, informing the council that he had begun a meat business in the town. From G. E. DeWitt, stating that he would require a compensation for performing the duties of sanitary inspector for the town.

From Com. from Acadia Athenaeum Society, respecting license charged for lectures under the auspices of that society. Resolved that the Acadia Athenaeum Society be refunded the sum of \$4.00, collected for license fee for lectures.

Coun. F. J. Porter gave notice that he would move the following amendment to the by-laws at next meeting: "That clause 116 of the by-laws regarding exhibitions be amended, and that lectures be included with other entertainments and be liable to pay a license fee; and that all entertainments that take a fee at the door pay a license."

That clause 111 of the town by-laws regarding dog-tax, be amended and read "shall pay annually a tax of one dollar, instead of two dollars as it now reads." L. E. Ducauson was appointed fire constable in place of S. P. Benjamin, resigned; and T. B. Wallace constable in place of L. A. Murphy, resigned.

Resolved that by-law No. 101 be changed to read 25 cents, instead of \$1.00 for each parking pound; and 25 cents instead of 50 cents for feeding the stock. Mr. L. E. Ducauson was present and on permission being granted addressed the Council, asking that the new street leading from Keene street south be taken over by the town.

Resolved that the Council accept the street running south past residence of Rev. C. C. Burgess, W. P. Blenkhorn and E. W. Eagles, say 1000 feet long, provided that the said street is laid out by a surveyor and is of the required width and to the satisfaction of the street committee.

Resolved that the appointment of a sanitary inspector be deferred until next meeting. The following estimates for the current year were passed: EXPENDITURE 1895, Poor \$200.00, Police 100.00, Schools 2245.54, Roads 750.00, Lights 500.00, Salaries 500.00, Contingency 400.00, County Fund 1200.00.
