KEEP SOME BEES.

Every farmer ought to keep a few stand of bees. His land and the neighborhood around him supplies the bee pasturage free of cost. If not used it is wasted and possibly worse, as the bees aid in fertilizing many kinds of blooms that would es se be barren. There is a yearly profit in the honey as well as the interest of keeping their cows at all times. The first freezing does not injure the plant. It is the alternation of freezing and thawing in the spring that is the most hurtful.

It is pretty generally accepted belief that the morning milk of a cow is richer in butter fat than the even ing milk, and the explanation given for it is that the cow is resting a night, and so loses no fat through muscular exercise.
