Austrian Emperor's New Departure in Vienna.

London, March 1.—Under the immediate patronage of the Emperor Francis Joseph there will shortly be opened in Vienna an imposing block of buildings forming a kind of composite people's workshops and model dwellings. The object of the undertaking is to help the very large number of artisans working at home by providing them with well ventilated and well equipped workshops, instead of the meagre and inhealthful quarters of their own homes.

The new building had cost more than \$300,000, and comprises about 130 workshops, large and small, and 120 flat apartments. The workshops are equipped, with every technical appliance needed for home working trades, and special attention has been paid to sanitary requirements. The rents are fixed as low as possible and every kind of artisan will be accepted as dangerous or injurious to the public health.
