WOODS FULL OF BIG GAME

Great Numbers of Moose, Deer and Caribou Make Their Home on the North West Miramichi.

Edwin B. Holmes of Boston, who came out from a trip up the North West Miramichi with Arthur Pringle as guide, saw the following game during his cruise:— Moose—14 Bulls, 31 Cows, 2 Calves.

Caribou—3 Bulls, 3 Cows. Deer—4 Bucks, 40 Does. Besides these the party heard, but did not see, 13 bull moose and 5 cows.

Mr. Holmes was sick most of his time in the woods. This shows that there is lots of sport awaiting the hunter in the vicinity of Bald Mountain.

Dr. Willard and W. L. Watson of New York came out from the same region a few days ago. They had the same guide. They report seeing 27 moose, 4 deer and 90 caribou.

While up visiting the lumber camps the other day, Ernest Sinclair shot from the hay shed at Cains Camp an old bear.

He had no teeth, which testified to his great age. Ernest shot him through the breast and he went 200 yards before he dropped.

Ernest took out lanterns and proudly brought the prey into camp. Dr. S. W. Dougherty and Mr. W. W. Wagner, of Philadelphia, returned from the woods a few days ago.

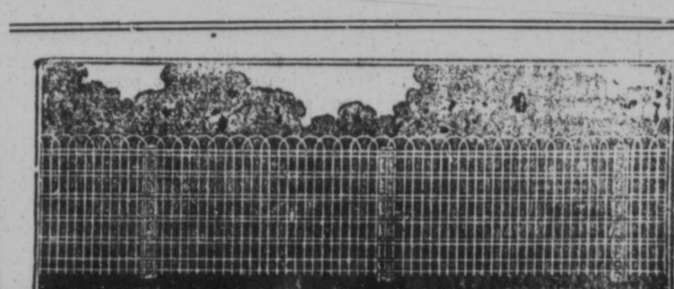
