NEW BRUNSWICK BONDS SOLD

The offer of Harris Forbes Company, New York and Montreal, for 1,552,000 of 10 year six per cent province of New Brunswick bonds, payable at New York, has been accepted, the bid being 98.7, making the actual rate of interest which the province will pay 6.17 per cent. exclusive of consideration of the exchange on interest payments. This bid was said to be approximately 5000 more favorable than the highest tender for the 15-year bonds.

FIRST SPEAKER OF NEW PARLIAMENT

The Hon. Hugh O'Neill, who has been named as the first Speaker of the Northern Irish parliament, claims descent from one of the ancient Irish kings—that Neill who was king at least 1,000 years ago. His father holds an Irish barony of a nineteenth century creation. Shane's Castle, the family estate, is a richly wooded picturesque place on the shores of Lough Neagh, the fourth largest fresh water lake in Europe. In the grounds of the mansions are some interesting ruined towers and a fortified wall. The Hon. Hugh O'Neill has been a Conservative member of the British parliament for Mid-Antrim since 1914, when he succeeded his brother Arthur who was an officer of the 2nd Life Guards, and the first member of parliament killed in the world war.

DOCTORS PITY THE PRESIDENT

Washington, June 25—President Harding's task in having shaken hands with more than 1,500 persons during his reception to delegates to the American Institute of Homeopaths convention aroused compassion among the doctors at the closing session today and a resolution proposing that Presidents hereafter be relieved of that custom was introduced.

It was voted down, however, speakers declaring the President should be permitted to attend to his own business.

BIG COAL STRIKE ENDED YESTERDAY

London, June 28—The British coal strike will end next Monday.

Announcing the settlement in the House of Commons Premier Lloyd George justified the granting of the £10,000,000 to the mining industry on the ground that coal exporting districts were so hard hit by the collapse of the export trade that, if economic conditions had full play, there would be unsupportable reductions in wages. The settlement, he said, was a great and promising experiment; no such principles had ever before been applied in such a vast scale in any industry. He was hopeful that it would inaugurate new relations between capital and labor, not only in coal, but other industries, and he believed that if it was sincerely carried out with good-will it would repay the nation for all the damage suffered through the dispute.

The British coal industry will have been idle 94 days when the miners resume Monday. While in point of duration this closely approaches the record for a British mine stoppage established in 1897, when the strike lasted sixteen weeks, its effect upon the nation's industrial and economic life admittedly has been far more disastrous. Through the enforced closing of steel mills and the curtailment of rail services and other industries closely allied with or dependent upon mining, the ranks of the unemployed have been enormously swelled and the resultant hardships have been increasingly felt by owners, investors, workers and all classes of the population.

Profit Sharing Principle

London, June 28—The House of Parliament tonight completed the settlement of the miners' strike by sanctioning a wage subsidy agreement which will stand until December 31, 1922, and will then be terminable on three months' notice, thereafter.

Reductions in wages are two shillings in July; half a crown in August and three shillings in September. The men are to resume work on Monday.
