The most signal honor France can bestow has been conferred upon little Marcelle Semmer for her heroism in the war.

The orator of the occasion, Mr. Klutz, from the department of the Somme, began his address by an eulogy of the obscure and unnumbered heroines of the war.

By this audacious act Marcelle Semmer held up the advance of an entire German army corps until the following morning.

In spite of all the risks, the young girl insisted on remaining in her village during the German occupation. In a subterranean passage used in the working of a phosphate mine near Eclusier the brave Marcelle managed to conceal no less than sixteen French soldiers who had strayed from their commands in the precipitate retreat from Charleroi and Mons.

While she was helping a seventeenth she was caught by a detachment of Germans, who dragged her and the French soldier before the local commander.

"Yes! And he is not the first. I helped sixteen others and I got them where you cannot catch them. Do what you will with me now. I am an orphan and have but one mother—France! I am not afraid to die."

"This little heroine of Picardy, this admirable girl, this incarnation of the qualities of the woman of France, this girl of simple origin, flawless dignity, of serious mind and gentle ways, this girl of indomitable will power, is here, ladies and gentlemen, here among you, in this room."
