Big Wages for Labourers at Halifax.

In view of the great scarcity of workmen at present in Halifax and the superabundance of labor, long-shoremen there are being paid fancy wages. The Stephano was detained at that port last week during which time the men working at her cargo "struck" for more pay. Their demands were almost immediately acceded to. The rates now for long-shoremen are 45 cents an hour by day time, 65 cents by night and 85 on Sundays or from early morning till midnight; on an ordinary week day the pay is \$7.75. Even at that attractive wage, there is great difficulty to secure workmen. We understand there is a gentleman now in this city endeavoring to get labourers to send to Halifax.

Canadian Loan Was Over-subscribed.

London, March 30.—Allotments of the Canadian Government loan to-day showed that there was not enough to go round. Applicants for large amounts received only sixty-six per cent, while small applicants, ranging from £100 to £1,000 received full allotments. The successful result of the loan had a good effect on the market.

Sir George Perley, together with other representatives of the Overseas Dominions, recently met Lloyd George, Chancellor of the Exchequer, and discussed financial arrangements, the decision arrived at being that loans to be floated were to be devoted to the payment of maturing indebtedness and the carrying on of works under construction and contract.

The General Laurie Reaches Port.

Mr. G. M. Barr's new purchase, the schooner General Laurie, Capt. Reuben Benson, reached port at 6 a.m. yesterday, after a quick passage of 8 days. For three days after leaving almost dead calm weather was experienced, when on the fourth day a strong breeze sprung up which later increased in violence, causing considerable inconvenience to the captain and crew, as the sailing powers of the ship were unknown to them. On Friday last the gale reached its height and under bare topmasts and reefed lower sails the ship showed her heels and tearing through the seas the log recorded 11 to 12 knots per hour. Using the words of her young captain, "she behaved like a bird." Captain Reuben Benson is a brother of Captain Arthur Benson of the schooner Novelty and is on his first trip in command. We congratulate the young captain and wish him every success. The schooner has a nett tonnage of 198 tons and 237 gross, and can carry 160 low deck 3,600 fish drums. She was built in Nova Scotia seven years ago. She brought as freight a large quantity of oil and some general cargo.

Erik Puts Back Leaking

The S. S. Erik, Capt. Taylor, put in to port Saturday evening for repairs. She is laden with copper ore and bound from Tilt Cove for New York. After leaving Tilt Cove it was found that she was leaking in the rudder case and in that state Capt. Taylor considered it unwise to continue the voyage and bore up for St. John's, sheltering at Trinity on the way along on account of the dense fog that prevailed. Part of the ship's cargo will be unloaded to have repairs effected.

Strange Find.

Mr. Nicholas Roache, the well-known fisherman-farmer of Middle Cove, made a somewhat strange and suggestive find on Tuesday last. While walking along the beach at the foot of a cliff near his home he picked up a sealer's bag, containing one pair of blankets and a small piece of iron marked "A.W." The bag had been washed ashore, but the question is, what does it suggest. The strongest theory adduced, supported by the fact that no tragedy occurred during the sealing season this year, is that the bag in question was lost from the deck of the whaler Cabot, which was engaged bringing sealers to their homes to the northward during the early part of last month.
