Many fans and enthusiasts attended last evening's annual meeting of the Hockey League. The officers for the ensuing year, elected after the reports had been submitted and passed, were: Hon. W. J. Higgins, K. C., President. Mr. John Tobin, Secretary-Treasurer.

A representative of the Victoria team present announced that, as some of their best players had decided to drop out, it had been deemed inadvisable to continue under the same name. The three remaining members of the team—two Powers and Munn—will be absorbed by other teams. Applications from St. Bon's and St. Andrew's teams for official recognition were approved, and those two teams will be in this season's League games.

Better quarters for the players in the rink was a matter brought up, and it was decided that the management of the "Icehouse" be written and requested to grant the improvements. It was also decided to play six-men games. The teams will wear all new uniforms this year. Two rounds for the championship will be played, and in the event of the second not being able to be played the championship will go to the team with the highest standing.

Another meeting will be held at a future date. A decision regarding the inviting of a Canadian team here will then be made. This season's fixtures are:—

The Municipal Council held its regular weekly session last evening. The Mayor presided and Councillors Mulhally, Ayre and Vinnicombe were present. After reading of minutes, etc., the following matters were discussed:

After disposing of routine business and passing pay rolls and bills the meeting adjourned.
