### Newfoundland's Grievance.

We print on another page an interesting statement by Mr. Coaker. the Minister of Marine and Fisheries in the Newfoundland Government. (This interview has already been published in the Newfoundland press .--- Ed. Telegram). Mr. Coaker accuses the Colonial Office of indifference to the needs of that Dominion, and asserts that not only is Iceland codfish allowed to enter the United Kingdom at prices which undercut the price of Newfoundland fish, but that no action is taken to induce Italy to accord fair treatment to the produce of the island's fisheries. He states that while Newfoundland is anxious to secure reciprocal preference with the United Kingdom, the Dominion may be forced to negotiate a trade agreement with the United States unless more consideration is given by this country to Newfoundland's needs. We trust that this complaint will be given prompt attention by the Imperial Government, but it is necessary to recall that the Newfoundland Government has adopted the policy of attempting to dictate the price at which codfish shall be sold. It seems likely, therefore, that some of the present difficulty in disposing of the produce of the island's fisheries may be traced to an attempt to interfere with the law of supply and demand.-London Times.
