St. John's Municipal Council. PUBLIC NOTICE.

Under and by virtue of the Consolidated Statutes (Third Series), Cap. 60; Sec. 159, the following Regulations, governing taxes on horses, carriages, etc., passed at a meeting of the Saint John's Municipal Council, held April 14th, 1921, are hereby published:

(1) An annual tax of \$2.00 upon every horse kept or used within the limits of the town for hire or private use to be paid by the owner of such horse.

(2) An annual tax of \$2.00 upon every cart or truck with not more than two wheels, drawn by a horse within the limits of the town to be paid by the owner of such cart or truck.

(3) An annual tax of \$3.00 upon every carriage, wagon, cab, truck or cart; provided that in the case of any person who has paid the annual taxes for the current year upon a horse and cart as required by Sections 1 and 2, and is desirous of using a carriage or wagon with the same horse, this tax shall be reduced to \$1.00.
