### Of Interest to Women

#### EDUCATIONAL SURVEY IN B.C. CURRICULA CRITICISED.

VANCOUVER, B.C., Oct. 30 (By Canadian Press).—The report of the Educational survey just completed and printed in full in the local press is of interest to parents elsewhere. The survey states that the average British Columbia child is nine months behind the normal, and that 37 per cent. of retardation is preventable. In interior points it ran as high as 30 months. "The Survey doubts whether the smattering of Latin and French three-quarters of the high school girls now receive, will help them make their own dresses or prepare a dinner in 1940. The arithmetic of elementary schools, without the addition of a high-school course would answer most of their prospective needs in that subject. A knowledge of music would be of more help than a hazy memory of geometry. The ability to express oneself with pen or tongue would be better than algebra."

In the opinion of the Survey home economics for girls should be encouraged to a vastly greater extent than it is. It presages, indeed, for its inclusion in the qualification for matriculation and it suggests the appointment of a woman advisor for high school girls. "She should be a teacher possessed of the proper temperamental qualities and should bear the title of associate principal. The plain truth is that the programmes are practically forcing 80 per cent. of the pupils to take courses that they ought not to take, and would not be permitted to take if allowed an intelligent choice; in order to suit the needs of 40 per cent. who take these courses to enter normal or university," says the report.

#### DIAMOND JUBILEE OF W.C.T.W.

TORONTO, Ont., Oct. 23 (Can. Press).—The Diamond Jubilee Banquet of the Toronto District W.C.T.U. drew nearly a thousand guests to its festal and speech-making. A birthday cake sparkled with 50 candles. Mayor Ferguson gave his official welcome and then, Mrs. William Ferguson, in proposing the toast to the mother union of Toronto, told how the W.C.T.U. had pioneered in many reforms. Out of its Kitchen Garden Department had developed the widespread teaching of domestic science. In the early days work among prisoners had been the deep concern of the W.C.T.U., and today the Juvenile Court and the Domestic Relations Court were some of the rich-fruitage of seed sown then. In Sabbath observance, women's suffrage and better working conditions for girls, the union had had its share. The motherhood of the W.C.T.U. was a motherhood of activity.

#### CANADIAN SECURES DIVORCE THROUGH WRITTEN ADMISION.

EDMONTON, Alta., Oct. 23 (Can. Press).—A divorce decree nisi was granted Geo. Kolyk, of Edmonton, whose wife, Magda, living in Poland, gave him his freedom by written admissions, refusing to return. The parties were married in Poland but after living in Canada for three years the wife departed, alleging that she was afraid to undergo an operation.

#### USEFUL DISPOSAL OF DISCARDED APPLES.

TORONTO, Ont., Oct. 24 (Can. Press).—A letter from a woman on the waste-age of apples, printed locally says: "Could not a committee of women of the calibre and executive ability of some of those women at the head of different organizations who so successfully finance such societies as the

W.M.S., the I.O.D.E., the Y.W.C.A., and the heads of different charitable homes get together and evolve some scheme by which this fruit could be placed where it would do most good? Are there not trucks belonging to the city or to generous business concerns that might be available to bring in the apples after they had been gathered and loaded by unemployed men sent out for the purpose? Could not these men be paid by the Federation for Community Service? Would it not be better to pay them for work than to give them the charity? Any surplus apples could be given to charitable institutions and to the Salvation Army. Of course it would have to be arranged so that the farmer's usual sale of apples should not be interfered with."

#### CHARGED WITH BEING A COMMUNIST.

NEW YORK, N.Y., Oct. 28 (Can. Press).—Miss Charlotte Anita Whitney, facing a jail sentence of from one to fourteen years for being a member of the Communist Labor Party, is vigorously appealing for by R. W. Ellis in a letter to the press, who says: "A national-wide appeal to Governor Richardson of California is being organized by the American Civil Liberties Union, a body which is intent only upon conserving freedom of speech, of assembly and of the press. Miss Whitney is a niece of a Supreme Court Judge. She is very much of the type of Jane Adams, holding many offices in charitable women's suffrage and university circles. Through her social work in 1919 she joined the Communist Labor party. In 1920 she was convicted by the California courts of membership in this party. There was no charge that she advocated violence in governmental reform. As a matter of fact, she repeatedly urged in her party counsels only peaceful methods. Her conviction, therefore, was based entirely on her membership in that party. It is a fundamental principle of law that guilt must be personal. The doctrine of guilt by association was characteristic of the Middle Ages. It has no place in our modern democracy."

#### PROVES HER WORTH.

TORONTO, Ont., Oct. 23 (Can. Press).—The "Globe" says editorially: "It took only four months to make a prize-winning Canadian farm woman of Mrs. W. N. Smith, lately of England now of British Columbia. With her husband and six children she arrived in Canada last May, and this autumn she competed at the Milner B.C. Fall Fair, winning first prize in butter, fancy butter, and cream cheese, and second for clotted cream. Mrs. Smith made good butter and cheese on her husband's farm in England, and immediately they settled on their forty-acre farm at Fort Langley she put her knowledge to practice."

### A Dead Hermit's Gold Claimed by Nephews

DAIRYMAN FOUND DEAD IN HIS OFFICE IN LONDON, ENGLAND, LEFT \$10,000.

A hoard of sovereigns, half sovereigns, treasury notes, war bonds and bank notes worth more than £2,000 was found by the city coronor's officer on the premises at Farringdon Street, E.C., of David Jones, 75, a dairyman and tea-shop proprietor, who died suddenly in a chair after leading what was apparently a hermit-like existence.

At the inquest held by Dr. F. J. Waldo, it was stated that Jones was unmarried, and had made a will leaving everything to a brother, who had, however, predeceased him.

Mr. J. T. Lewis, of Baywater, W., probate registrar of Oxford, who drew up the will, said there was a lot of property. He added: "There was a nephew, a son of Jones' sister, and he must be getting on for 50."

The coronor's officer said that Jones had more than £1,000 in his current bank account.

During a discussion concerning the estate, Dr. Waldo said: "Somebody may turn up and say, 'I am the nephew.'"

Mr. Lewis: You may depend that within a week "relatives" will be round like flies.

The coronor's officer produced a postcard sent to Jones from Bexhill-on-Sea on August 11 last. It began: "Dear Uncle," and was signed, "Yours affectionately, Arthur."

Mr. Lewis: That man will turn up all right.

A verdict of death from natural causes was returned.  
 The next day three men living at Bexhill, S.W., and claiming to be nephews of Mr. Jones, got into communication with Mr. J. T. Lewis, probate registrar of Oxford.

Absolute supremacy of law and the judiciary to be independent of the executive.

An elected representative assembly, of which the Legislature of each state is to be a part, and to which the executive of the Government will be responsible and subordinate.

A system of autonomous local institutions.

An executive council of which at

least half the members will be elected by the representative assembly.

Full freedom of speech and criticism, subject only to the conditions imposed by the ordinary penal law.

These demands are described as a sort of Indian Magna Charta.
