

On appeal, the Divisional Court reversed this decision and held that, in the absence of express conditions requiring the passenger who had paid his fare and received the ticket to display the latter on demand, the company have no right to eject him for failing to do so. The company took the case to the Court of Appeal and the majority of this court agree with the judgment of the court below. Mr. Justic Osler dissented, holding that the very purpose of giving a passenger a ticket is that he may prove to the conductor that he has paid his fare, and that he takes it with the condition annexed to it, that he shall produce it when called upon. The appeal was dismissed with costs.
