**LATEST MARKETS**

**LOCAL MARKET.** London, Thursday, April 6.

Notwithstanding the cold wind, making it unpleasant for the farmers and others, there was a good-sized crowd in attendance today. There was considerable small stuff offered. Sales were fairly brisk and prices were about the same as those paid on Tuesday.

Grain—Oats were scarce, only four loads being marketed; sales were made at \$1.20 and \$1.22 per cwt.

Hay and Straw—There were 22 loads of hay offered; sales were fairly brisk, at \$8 and \$8.50 per ton. Straw was more plentiful and dull of sale, at \$2.50 and \$3 per ton.

Butter and Eggs—Not a great deal of butter offered, and most of the sales were made at 25c to 26c for pound rolls; there were only a few loads of butter offered, and prices were about the same as those paid on Tuesday.

Apples—Sales were extremely dull, and quite a few were unsold at 12 o'clock; prices were as quoted.

Vegetables and Roots—Potatoes were in fair supply, and sales were on the slow side, at 8c and 8c per bag; rhubarb was in good demand at 30c and 31c per dozen; green onions, 45c to 50c per dozen; lettuce, 40c per dozen; other vegetables as quoted.

Dressed Hogs—About 30 were offered; sales were made mostly at \$7.75 per cwt; a few went at \$7.50.

Maple Syrup—Four or five cans were offered; sales were brisk, at \$1.25 per gallon.

Poultry—There was not much offered; prices were as quoted; a couple of crates of live chickens went at 8c per lb.

Butcher's Meats—Not a great deal on the market; enough, however, to meet the demand; prices as quoted.
