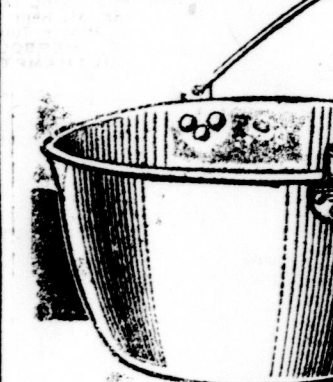

PAY 6 MILLIONS FOR ACCIDENTS

Ontario Workmen's Compensation Board Reveals Activities For Year.

45,191 Claims of Workmen Settled Without Redress To Courts.

TORONTO, July 6.—According to the 1921 report of the workmen's compensation board for Ontario, handed to The London Advertiser today, the board during the year paid out \$6,189,263.49 in settlement of 45,191 accident claims.

This shows a considerable decrease as compared with 1920, when compensations totalled \$7,780,145.25 paid on 54,851 accidents. Fatal accidents numbered 386 in 1921 and 452 in 1920. This large sum meant an outlay of \$20,637 per day, covered by 485 checks, while the reports of the accidents averaged 151 daily.

The workmen's compensation act during its seven years of operation has dealt with 271,807 claims, for which \$27,947,653.45 was awarded in compensation and medical aid benefits. Employers pay the cost and the board merely distributes the money in a way that makes unnecessary all the claims for damages through the courts, which were so frequent in the old days.

Now for every \$100 of payroll the employer pays the board \$12, and out of the huge sum of two and three-quarter billion dollars of payroll in Ontario industrial concerns have paid the province money sufficient to meet nearly 28 millions in claims.

Those who benefit are not only the workmen crippled or injured in the industries covered by the act, but also widows, children and parents of workmen who have been killed. Ontario was the first to adopt this humane act to alleviate distress among the victims of accidents and their families, and five other provinces are following Ontario's example.

Distinguishing features of the act are collective liability of the employers in each class of industry, and simplicity and inexpensiveness of procedure.

It differs from the old law which it superseded by covering all accidents arising out of and in the course of the employment instead of merely those which were caused by the negligence or breach of duty of the employer, and in substituting informal administration by a board for the technicality and stringency of court procedure.

It differs from the compensation laws of most of the United States in making the employers in the various classes of industry collectively, and not individually, liable for payment of the benefits, though certain employers, such as railway and navigation companies, municipalities, etc., included in what is known as schedule 2, are upon the individual liability basis.

TRY TO INTERDICT ADELARD DELORME

Brother-in-Law Wants Council of Family To Be Held in Court July 18.

MONTREAL, July 6.—Application to interdict Adelard Delorme was made by Adelard Trestreault, a brother-in-law, in superior court this morning before Mr. Justice Lafontaine in chambers. The request asks also that a council of the family be called on July 18, in accordance with the legal practice. The court assented to this date.

An insane, furious or otherwise mentally unbalanced person may not, according to law, exercise any civil acts, such as the administration of an estate, or even his own property. In such an event as the present, a relative, if one exists, must present to the superior court a petition asking that the person thus afflicted be interdicted or prevented from acting in any administrative capacity.

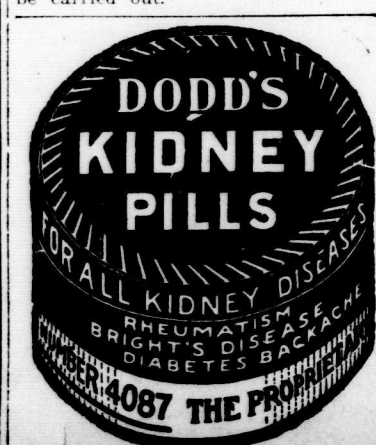
Before, however, the courts will assent, there must be called a family council of seven relatives of the person, who are asked to submit evidence as to the mental capacity of the insane one.

If the person is free at the time of this inquiry he must be called to the court and be interrogated himself. To preclude the possibility of having Delorme himself appear the family council has been requested to take place after the order of incarceration from the attorney-general's office has been issued.

The family council will take place in superior court in the presence of a judge, who, after hearing evidence, will decide whether or not the object of the application should be interdicted.

FORD ADMITS CANADIAN EXTENSIONS PLANNED

Special to London Advertiser. WINDSOR, July 6.—That huge extensions to the plant of the Canadian Ford Motor Company are planned was admitted by Henry Ford, when interviewed this afternoon by a representative of The Advertiser.

Mr. Ford said that several hundred acres of land adjacent to the Ford factory had been purchased by the Canadian company. Further announcement, he said, would be made by the executive of the Canadian company. Wallace R. Campbell, vice-president of the company, declined to talk

about the extensions admitted by Mr. Ford. An announcement at present, he explained, would be untimely. Local realtors said that Ford interests have purchased 900 acres at Ford. Some of the property is on the river front, and another large slice is south of the Grand Trunk tracks. This, it is said, will be the site of a huge tractor plant.

LURE TOURISTS TO LAKE SHORE

Attractions of Port Stanley Are Widely and Favorably Known.

Scenic Beauties Compel Admiration From Thousands of Visitors.

Port Stanley, Western Ontario's greatest summer resort, is increasing in popularity daily. One can take boat trips on the lake in a small-sized steamer for a small sum, or one can hire a canoe or a rowboat. On sunny afternoons the harbor and the river are dotted with small craft.

Beach Shades Provided. Adjoining the bathhouse, swings, sliding boards and other attractions have been provided for children. For mothers who sit on the beach and watch their tiny tots wading in the lake, umbrella-shaped shades have recently been placed on the beach.

At the Casino can be found all manner of conveniences and amusement places. Here one will find one of the finest dance floors in Canada, and one of the best orchestras on the Great Lakes or at any of the resorts along their shores.

Food can be obtained at reasonable prices at the lakeside. At the London and Port Stanley Railway cafeteria and many lunch counters along the board walk and on the hill the best of service is given.

Scores of games, "hot dog" and ice cream booths line the board walk, in fact, every kind of booth peculiar to a summer resort is found at Port Stanley.

When Western Ontario residents and many non-residents think of summer holidays and the pleasures at the lakeside, they naturally think of Port Stanley, such an attraction does this famous resort hold for persons in this part of the province.
