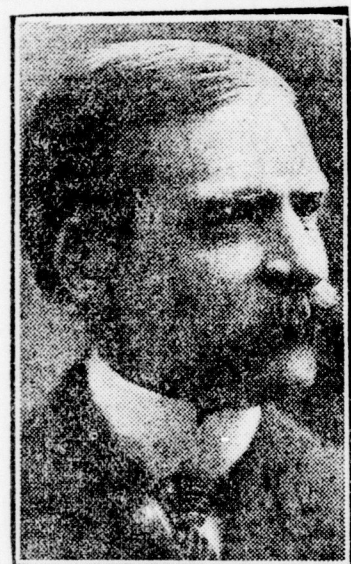

London, March 13.—Philip Snowden, chancellor of the exchequer, has issued a message warmly commending the work of the national savings banks and their efforts to attract the general body of the populace to invest in savings certificates. London, March 13.—Arthur Ponsonby, under secretary for foreign affairs, declared in the house of commons yesterday that there were difficulties in the way of suitable legislation to prevent liquor being shipped from the Clyde for the United States as it entailed restrictions which would seriously hamper legitimate trade. A treaty with the United States, he added, was recently laid before Parliament, which would facilitate the control of smuggling into United States territory.


