In severing my official connection with the administration, I wish for your continued health and the highest measure of success in carrying out the great work entrusted to you.

"I have the honor to be very respectfully, 'Your obedient servant,'

"R. A. ALGER."

The President replied: 'Executive Mansion, 'Washington, D. C., July 20, 1899.

"Hon. R. A. Alger, Secretary of War: 'Dear Sir,—Your resignation of the office of secretary of war, under date of July 19, is accepted, to take effect August 1, 1899, thus severing the official relation which has continued for more than two years. I desire to thank you for the faithful service you have rendered the country at a most exacting period, and to wish you a long and happy life.
