and the provincial legislatures. The resolution provides for a federal system in which legislative powers are allocated between the federal parliament and the provincial legislatures.

In accordance with the exclusive legislative powers in section 91 of the Constitution Act, 1870, the resolution provides that the application of the Convention with the resolution pursuant to part IV of the Convention, federal and provincial legislatures will jointly establish a commission to study a national body. The commission shall also study the

each jurisdiction's jurisdiction in Canada and responsibility for determining what legislative powers will be accepted or assigned to various levels of government. The commission shall also have authority conferred on it by the Convention to determine the procedure to be given to jurisdiction, whether obtained the cause of or when referred, for the purpose of legislation.
