GOVERNMENT WILL CONTINUE TO BE A STRONG PROPONENT OF THE MULTILATERAL TRADING ORDER. WE WILL STRIVE TO DEVELOP THE INTERNATIONAL CONSENSUS NECESSARY TO BEGIN A NEW ROUND OF GATT NEGOTIATIONS IN SUCH AREAS AS SAFEGUARD ARRANGEMENTS, PROCUREMENT, AGRICULTURAL TRADE AND TRADE IN HIGH TECHNOLOGY.

THE CREATION OF AN INTERNATIONAL FRAMEWORK FOR

TRADE IN VARIOUS SERVICES WILL ALSO BE HIGH ON THE AGENDA OF

THE NEW GOVERNMENT, AND I WELCOME YOUR VIEWS ON HOW BEST TO

PROCEED IN THESE COMPLEX SECTORS.

AT THE SAME TIME, WE BELIEVE THERE MAY BE
OPPORTUNITIES TO SET BILATERAL PRECEDENTS WHICH WILL SPUR
MULTILATERAL ACTION.

WE WILL CONTINUE THE DIALOGUE WITH AMERICAN
OFFICIALS TO EXPLORE POTENTIAL AREAS FOR ACTION WHICH ARE
CONSISTENT WITH OUR MULTILATERAL OBLIGATIONS.
