mission scheduled public hearings to consider the applications for February, 1981, and the chairman of the commission promised that they will render a speedy decision.

The Minister of Communications (Mr. Fox) is optimistic that later in 1981 a multichannel satellite service will be available on the Anik system. For the interim, in compliance with the second recommendation of the Therrien committee, the minister encouraged the CBC, the CTV and TVA to implement an interim satellite television package. They have agreed to pursue the matter and are currently in consultation with the CRC to finalize the details.
