Mr. John Evans (Parliamentary Secretary to President of the Privy Council): Mr. Speaker, the following questions will be answered today: Nos. 259, 353 and 365.

NORTHERN TRANSPORTATION COMPANY LIMITED

Question No. 259-Mr. Schellenberger:

- 1. Does the Northern Transportation Company Limited designate barges for fuel service only and, if so (a) how many are in service (b) what types of fuel do they carry?
- 2. Do the barges carry deck cargo when not carrying fuel and, if so, are (a) they stripped of their fuel retains (b) the tanks purged prior to use of the deck area for vehicular traffic and storage of deck cargo?

Hon. Lloyd Axworthy (Minister of Transport): The Northern Transportation Company Limited advises as follows:

1. The barges in Northern Transportation's operating fleet are all dual purpose, capable of use for dry cargo and petroleum products. They are used for either or both types of cargo depending on the mix of goods to be transported.

The petroleum products carried include various grades of oil including bunker, diesel, leaded motor alkalite, aviation and motor gasoline, leaded and unleaded, and jet fuels.

2. It is current policy and practice that barges which have been in fuel service for highly volatile products and which are subsequently designated for dry cargo, are stripped and gasfreed prior to cargo operations.

- 1. For the fiscal year 1982-83 what was the total budget for Design Canada and what was its mandate?
- 2. In the same year, how many persons were directly employed by the Agency?

Hon. Ed Lumley (Minister or Regional Industrial Expansion): 1. For the fiscal year 1982-83, the total budget for Design Canada was \$1,099,221, including salaries. Its man-

date was to promote and expedite improvement of design in products of the Canadian industry.

2. In the same year, 20 persons were directly employed by the Agency.
