THE SOCIETY.

1. The Society shall consist of graduates and undergraduates of Toronto University, and such other persons as may be elected Corresponding or Honorary Members, in accordance with Article II, sections 3 and 5.

2. It shall be called the University of Toronto Mathematical and Physical Society, aldianogen ed visione and to against the hard against the proceedings of the society.

2. Ordinary members ahall consist of members of the Faculty in the department of Mathematics and Physics, and undergraduates in that department.

3. Corresponding members shall consist of such graduates in the department of Mathematics and Physics of Toronto University as are not included under section 2, and such other persons as may be elected by a vote of five-sixths of the members present at any regular meeting of the Society.

Life members shall consist of such Ordinary members as shall have paid four years'membership fees and an additional fee of three dollars.

5. Honorary members shall consist of the past Presidents of the Society, and such other persons as the Society may elect on account of merit, such election being by a vote of at least five-sixths of the members present at any regular meeting of the Society.

6.0 Candidates for Corresponding or Honorary membership shall be nominated at the meeting previous to their election.

7. No election shall be necessary for Ordinary membership.

8. No Ordinary member shall be entitled to vote at any election or be elected to any office until he has paid his fees for the current year.
