

townships laid out on the North bank of the Ottawa, in Lower Canada, are not at all or very slightly noticed; whilst in the Upper Province, Glengary, the Bay of Quinté, the Rice Lake, the townships along the Thames, and the whole of the Western District, all places of attraction, are equally omitted. The ingenious author partly accounts for this by hinting that he has not received answers to queries he had addressed on matters connected with the purposes of his publication to various parts of the country; and it is to be hoped that he may be encouraged to pursue his enquiries, collecting all the information he can, and embodying it in a third part, which I am persuaded would find many purchasers in the mother country; but it must not be disguised that to ensure its circulation there it ought to be more correctly printed, for, independent of two whole pages of errata, there are innumerable other errors of the press disgracing almost every page.

The directions to settlers appear to be judicious, and well worthy of their attention. Upon the whole the style is clear, and well adapted for those for whose use it is principally intended. I should not, however, have expected in an A. M. the scotticism of *severals* for *several*, or the yankeeisms, *elegant* when applied to a literary work, and *grade*.
