age of Twenty-one years, who are members, or adherents, of this Church, and profess their intention to support religion in this congregation, and who reside within the bounds of the same.

III. The Trustees shall hold office until disqualified by removal from the congregation or by ceasing to be mombers of the Church, or until they shall resign. Vacancies occurring in the number of Trustees shall be supplied at a meeting called in the manner specified in the preceding section.

IV. The persons who shall be eligible for the Office of the Ministry in this congregation shall be,—1. Any regularly ordained Minister, or duly liceused Probationer of the Prerbyterian Church of Canada, in connection with the Church of Scotland.—2. Any Minister or Probationer of the Church of Scotland.—3. Any Minister or Probationer of any Presbyterian Body holding the Westminster Confession of Faith and the Larger and Shorter Catechisms, who shall be willing to take the usual ordination vows and obey the Laws and Rules of the Presbyterian Church of Canada, in connection with the Church of Scotland; and who shall have been received as a Preacher by the Presbytery of the bounds; it being always understood that such Minister or Preacher shall have undergon such course of education, Literary, Scientific and Theological, as is now, or may hereafter be, required by the Synod, or other Supreme Court of this Church.

V. The Minister of this Church shall be a member of the Synod, or other Supreme Court, of the Presbyterian Church of Canada, in connection with the Church of Scotland, and shall acknowledge that Synod, or other Supreme Court, as his Supreme Ecclesia tical Judicatory, so long as he shall continue to be Minister of this Church.

VI. The first Minister shall be called by a majority of votes of all male persons above Twenty-one years of age who shall be resident within the bounds of the congregation, and who profess their adherence to the Presbyterian form of worship and their willingness to join with and support this Church. But in all future calls there shall be a majority of male communicants, of at least three months standing on the Roll, and free of Church censure, in order to render the call valid.

VII. All meetings for the election of a Minister shall be called by authority of the Presbytery, by public intimation after Divine Service, on at least one Sabbath ten days previous to the day of meeting; and all the procedure shall be in accordance with the Laws and usages of the Presbyterian Church of Canada, in connection with the Church of Scotland, and such regulations as the Presbytery of the bounds may adopt, agreeably to the said Laws and usages.

VIII. The temporal affairs of the Church shall be managed by a
