faloe, and then cross the Niagara river at the ferry, and wait for the Chippeway Steem boat to bring you up to Kettle Creek. When you arrive at New York, send us a letter and we will meet you at Kettle Creek. I have to tell Wheat is now selling at 1 Dollar a bushel, beef at 2½d. per lb. and mutton the same, and pork 4d. per pound in English money. Spirits is very cheap here. Farmer's men gets from 8 to 12 dollars a month and board and lodgings and washing and mending. I have no more to say at present, so I must conclude with my kind love to you all. I remain Your dutiful son Wm. Cooper—direct to Wm. Cooper township of Adelaide to be left at Colonel Mount Delaware, North America.
