WHEAT UP AT LIVERPOOL.

Paris Futures Some Higher Also Yesterday.

Peas Lower and Corn Higher—Flour and Bacon Off—Local Produce, Grain and Live Stock Markets—No American Exchange Open—Yesterday—Notes, Quotations and Gossip.

Tuesday Evening, Nov. 8.

The Chicago Board of Trade and other United States grain exchanges were closed to-day on account of the general election. The British markets, however, were strong, despite an advance in console, which latter fact is taken as an indication of an improved peace outlook. On the Liverpool board, futures to-day closed 1/2 to 3/4 cent above yesterday's final figures. Paris wheat rose 5 to 15 cent.

Liverpool maize advanced 1/4 cent per bush for spot today, while futures closed unchanged to 1/2 higher than yesterday.

Liverpool flour declined 1/4 to-day.

Peas declined 1/4 at Liverpool.

Bacon declined 1/4 at Liverpool.

Liverpool wheat receipts the past three days, 170,000 bushels, all American; corn 80,000 bushels, all American.

Since July 1 the aggregate exports of wheat and flour from America were equivalent to 73,545,265 bushels, against 88,814,414 bushels same period last year and extra 50,336,450 bushels, as compared with 50,628,104 bushels one year ago.

Stocks of wheat at Port Arthur and Fort William on Nov. 8 were 900,100 bushels, as against 831,849 bushels on Oct. 29 and 4,457,517 bushels a year ago.
